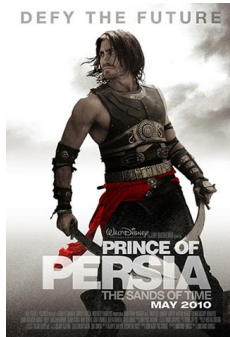


PRINCE OF PERSIA
